
Dominique Darbois (born 1925) is a French photojournalist and author, noted for her studies of exotic locales, artifacts, children, and primitive peoples. In 1946 she began photographing professionally, beginning with journalistic work in Cambodia. From 1949 to the present, she has photographed throughout the world, including Laos, Indonesia, USSR, Australia, Mexico, Guatemala,

Algeria, Iran, and the Congo. In 1952, she received the "Prix Exploration" from the President of the French Republic. From 1952 through 1978, she completed 20 books for the collection Les Enfants du Monde [Children of the World], These books are typically oversize quarto volumes featuring candid black-and-white photographs of children of various races and nationalities.





Camilla Koffler, "Ylla", 1911 - 1955) was born in Vienna, attended boarding school in Budapest, and studied sculpture in Belgrade. When she discovered that her name, Camilla stood for "Camel" in Serb, she changed it to Ylla. In 1931 she moved to Paris and worked as an assistant to photographer, Ergy Landau. In 1932 she began, what would be her "calling", photographing animals. In 1940, MoMA was instrumental in obtaining an entry visa for her and she settled in the U.S. in 1941. She published several collections on dogs, cats, ducks and chimps. This photograph of a Spaniel chewing
