In 1910 he made EN GRÈCE PAR MONTS ET PAR VAUX from his enormous archive of Greek negatives. That lavish large folio


was limited to 230 numbered copies printed on handmade paper; in 1936 he also issued a second edition in a smaller folio format with a larger limitation. This is the first edition published in English, and has a limitation of 300 numbered copies.



The resulting tonally reversed image is a montage of pictures and words that are both visually complex and a disturbing reflection of the society's values. The publishing history of this volume is a bit complicated: Published as an excerpt from a novel in progress "The Midnight

Socialists: A People's Soap Opera", it was issued by the press of a former Chicagoan, Robert Frontier, in an edition of 150 signed copies. Just prior to completing the edition, Robert Frontier was killed in an automobile accident. The remaining sheets of the edition were purchased by Eureka Editions, San Francisco, California, and six photographs by Aaron Siskind were added for the American audience. The binding of this American edition is in cloth rather than parchment and paper over boards, and a illustrated dw was added. The American edition copies were not numbered but they are they do include a signed and numbered drypoint by the author; this copy has "Wait 'Til Next Year" a portrait of a Chicago Cub's player in uniform.


