Abney made important contributions in the field, i.e. hydroquinone as developer (1880) and silver gelatino citrochloride printing out paper. Roosens and Salu 1135. OCLC locates 9 copies.



Essentially a publication of the Iowa City Poetry Workshop, this issue was designed by Joan Lyons, with a portfolio of 8 b&w photographs by Nathan Lyons, and poetry by Richard Kelly, Jessie Kachmar, Marvin Bell, Fortune Ryan, Gil Orlovitz, Ron Padgett, and Walter Chappell who is primarily known as a photographer. This short-lived periodical began publication in 1959 and ceased with no. 6 in 1963.



Extract from Mémories de la Société Impériale des Sciences, de l'Agriculture et des Arts de Lille, 1863. The photographic frontispiece was made by F. (rëdëric) Pierson. 

Madelois was the gentlemen's department of Trois Quartiers, the great Parisian department store founded in 1829. This catalogue exhibits his modernist graphic design, coupled with the excellent product photographs of Maurice Tabard. The offerings included tennis, golf, boxing, equestrian, swimming, yachting, and hunting equipment and their specific attire, as well as cameras, projectors, radios and phonographs. Alexey Brodovitch worked in the Trois Quartiers design studio, Athelkia, from 1928 to late 1930 when he emigrated to Philadelphia.









Andreas Feininger, born Paris 1906, studied under Walter Gropius at the Bauhaus, Weimar. He was included in the famously important Film und Foto exhibition of 1929, and became a staff photographer for Life magazine (1943 - 1962) This, his second book, reflects his Bauhaus training in experimentation. Many aspects of "graphic improvement" are described and pictured; direct projection, negative prints, negative-on-diapositive, granulation, and solarization.








"The existence of each sculpture is documented by its documentation. The documentation takes the form of photographs, maps, drawings and descriptive language" - Artist's statement on verso of the title page. "The significant event in terms of the history of artists' publications was Siegelaub's Douglas Huebler exhibition in November 1968. There, for the first time, the exhibition appeared principally as a catalogue. The nature of Huebler's work was such that it functioned equally well on the paper or on the wall, so viewing (or owning) the 'original' work, became, in effect, beside the point." Beginning with issue no. 13, portfolios of b&w photographs were included. The articles include original historical or critical subjects by known scholars, as well as interviews with modern practitioners.



The International World Exposition of 1900, held in Paris, was attended by nearly 50 million visitors. The exhibitions showcased the latest achievements in the sciences, arts and manufacturing; among them were two important applications of the photographic process: Métrophotographie (photogrammetry) and Chronophotographie, each a form of measurement documented with the aide of the camera and film.

Beginning in 1849, Colonel Amié Laussedat devised a photographic method and instruments for use in projective geometry as applied to topographic and architectural measurements. Etienne-Jules Marey is considered the inventor of chronophotography, the study of human and animal movement sequentially recorded on film, the precursor of the cinema.

In this publication, both Laussedat and Marey outline the history and shows examples of the instruments and applications of their processes. Scarce with OCLC locating only 7 copies.






The primary chapter on the dry collodio-albumen process includes a procedural manual and formulary. A chapter on landscape photography is of note; Mudd was well known for his landscapes. Subsequent chapters are often humorous; The Gin-And-Water Process, The Unfortunate Photographer and The Photographer's Dream.



Felix Rasumny, 1869 - 1940, was a painter, sculptor, jeweler naturalized French citizen in his youth and studied art under Aimé Millet,

and medalist. Born in Sevastapol, he became a naturalized French citizen in his youth and studied art under Aimé Millet, Camille Gauthier, and Paulin Tasset. He is well known for his prize medals.

This silver medal was awarded by the Exposition du Papier <NOAR>, a division of the Première Exposition des Arts et Industries de la Photographie, 1906. see Bulletin de la Société Française de Photographie, 1906, p. 148.







"Dear Weichsel: It is rather late to thank you for the splendid contribution to the 291 Number. It is one of the few really strong ones. The book is going to be of last (sic) value. It is going

to do real work, I'm sure. I know of nothing like it. Even the 'Insiders' will be surprised - & delighted. I am sorry to have missed you at 291. I have been chasing about quite a little, something the visitors to 291 have not been accustomed to. Hoping to see you soon - Picasso, Braque, and some Mexican art on now - with greetings- Stieglitz." Dr. John Weichsel was a seminal figure in the New York art circle in the late teens and twenties. He was a prominent

critic and founder of The People's Art Guild, and a frequent contributor to Camera Work. From 9 December 1914 - 11 January 1915, exhibited the artists mentioned in this letter.




