She opened a photographic studio in Berlin in 1934, but moved to the U.S. in 1940. She was a member of the Photo League, and referred to herself as a "social research" photographer. She used the money from a Rosenwald Fellowship to travel the U.S. photographing examples of racial discrimination. In these photos from 1940-1970, Palfi traveled from coast to coast, through the industrial northeast and the rural south to document the poor, the hungry, the abused and neglected of all races and colors.


